## Principal's Message

Dear Mesa Families,
It's hard to believe that winter break is nearly upon us. If I do not see or talk with you before then, please accept my warm thoughts for a safe, and joyous new year and holiday. In your travels near and far, I wish you a safe and enriching journey.
The charter trait word of the month is kindness for December and it is so gratifying to see the many, many acts and expression of kindness that are occurring (and supported by the teachers in their instruction) in all classes, kindergarten to 8th grade. Going hand-in-hand with kindness is Mesa School's "Fifth C," compassion. As you have time to spend with your children over this break, a good discussion might be ways to show active compassion.
Here are seven ways for all people (not just kids) to exhibit active compassion: (1) cultivate encouragement at all times; cultivate positive expectations for others and share these with them; (2) smile, and mean it, and hug appropriately, then couple this with words of encouragement or positive reinforcement; (3) be courteous at all times, and promote courteous behavior in the home, classroom, and school; (4) allow your children to take ownership of their learning and experiences, that is, involve them in decisions that affect them; don't be afraid to take a risk by giving them the "power" to make decisions; (5) promote and cultivate a deep appreciation of others by taking time to get to know them, asking carefully thought-out questions, and listening carefully to their answers; develop the ability to sense how others are feeling by closely studying body language; (6) maintain your temper and a calmness of mind even when faced with chaos or an agitated situation; (7) respect children's friendships and make positive comments about the friendships. These tenets of compassion go well with what you child studied in October, which as empathy.
As I said last month in my Thanksgiving message, Mesa School is a truly unique place be a student, to work, and to be involved in. If I had met Mesa 15 years ago, I would of surely been fortunate to have my own children attend the school. Thank you for all you do, families! I plan to spend the winter break in town and with my family.

- The ticket is valid for admission to ONE Six Flags theme park on SELECT DATES ONLY during the 2017 season. Park name and valid dates will be printed on the tickets. Please understand that the school can only select one Six Flags Theme Park. The ticket will only be valid for the park that is listed on the ticket. The valid dates will not be announced prior to the ticket award date in early May.
